SAUDI ARABIA CONFIRMED HOST OF 2034 WORLD

ON 31st October 2023 FIFA President Gianni Infantino confirmed Saudi Arabia as 2034 World Cup host as Australia's soccer federation announced it would not bid for it. In an online report by FOX Sports, soccer writer Doug McIntyre said that this was the second World Cup host announcement in less than a month: "On Oct. 11, FIFA revealed that the 2030 edition would be held in Morocco, Portugal and Spain – with the first three games of that tournament to be played in Argentina, Paraguay and Uruguay to mark the World Cup's centennial. The first showpiece competition was hosted in Uruguay in 1930. Canada, Mexico and the United States were chosen in 2018 to co-host the 2026 World Cup, which will be the first to include 48 participating nations. From France 1998 to last year's World Cup in Qatar, the men's tourney was contested by 32 teams."
